Overview

Physicians and staff of the Division of Neoplastic Diseases and Related Disorders at Froedtert & The Medical College of Wisconsin offer advanced, high quality, patient directed treatment for cancer patients. Our approach to cancer care is interdisciplinary and interprofessional; each board-certified medical oncologist is a cancer subspecialist who is primarily focused on a specific cancer type. These specialists offer the most advanced therapies and treatments available, including treatment of complex cases and enrollment in clinical trials.

- Team members include board certified medical oncologists who are cancer subspecialists in a unique type of cancer, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, social workers, cancer dietitians and case managers. Team members provide continuity of care as patients transition between inpatient, Day Hospital and outpatient care.
- The division has subspecialty experts in all cancers, blood and marrow transplantation, palliative care and hospice.
- Geriatric oncologist specializes in health and functional assessment of older adults to develop optimal treatment plans.
- Experts in the Blood and Lymph Node Cancer Program (Hematological Malignancy) are closely integrated with Blood and Marrow Transplant Program specialists, providing eligible patients the opportunity to be assessed for all treatment options.
- Physicians and staff participate in interdisciplinary tumor boards and other cancer-specific case conferences.
- A 25-bed, physician-supervised Day Hospital (open seven days a week) provides extended acute care in an outpatient setting; patients receive chemotherapy, blood transfusions, IV fluids and medications, and combined modality care.
- Dedicated Hematology/Oncology Clinic, Blood and Marrow Transplant Clinic, Hematology/Oncology Inpatient Unit and Blood and Marrow Transplant Inpatient Unit
- Recognized as one of six Centers for the Advancement of Palliative Care
