- Urologists who specialize in and have extensive training and experience in technique focused treatments (cryoablation including percutaneous cryoablation, robotically assisted surgeries, including prostatectomy and nephrectomy, laparoscopy, endourology)

- Specialize in complex cases, as well as early stage cancers
- Clinical trials available - team is consistently active in research initiatives in cooperation with national organizations, such as the National Cancer Institute, the Radiation Therapy Oncology Group, the American Surgical Oncology Group and others
